Management Discussion of Fund Performance

This management discussion of fund performance represents the portfolio management team's view of the significant factors and developments affecting the fund's performance and outlook.

Investment Objective and Strategies

Pursuant to the Declaration of Trust, the investment objective of AGF Canadian All Cap Strategic Equity Fund (the "Fund") is to provide risk-managed capital growth through exposure to shares of primarily Canadian companies, across the market capitalization spectrum, expected to profit from future economic growth. To achieve this objective, AGF Investments Inc. ("AGFI"), as portfolio manager, generally allocates the Fund's assets among underlying mutual funds (the "Underlying Funds") and exchange traded funds ("ETFs") managed by third parties or AGFI (or an AGFI affiliate). AGFI has set, and reviews quarterly, target dynamic allocations between Canadian equity funds and ETFs for the Fund, consistent with the Fund's investment objective. During periods of market downturn or for other reasons, a significant portion of the Fund's assets may be held in cash or cash equivalents.

Risk

The risks of investing in the Fund remain as disclosed in the current prospectus. Any changes to the Fund over the period have not affected the overall level of risk of the Fund.

The Fund continues to be suitable for investors seeking the growth potential of equity securities through a mix of small, medium and large capitalization Canadian companies, investing for the longer term with a medium tolerance for risk. The suitability of the Fund has not changed from what has been disclosed in the prospectus.

Results of Operations

For the year ended September 30, 2023, the Fund returned 10.3% (net of expenses) while the S&P/TSX Composite Index ("S&P/TSX Index") returned 9.5%.

The discussion below regarding the performance of the Fund references the performance of the ETFs and the Mutual Fund Shares of the Underlying Funds, as applicable. The Fund holds Series O Shares of the Underlying Funds. The performance of Series O Shares is substantially similar to that of Mutual Fund Shares, save for differences in expense structure.

The Fund out-performed the S&P/TSX Index due to sector allocation decisions which was partially offset by negative stock selection. The Industrials sector was the biggest contributor owing to positive stock selection. The

Information Technology sector also contributed to the Fund's performance due to an overweight allocation to the sector. The Materials sector was the biggest detractor due to negative stock selection. The Financials sector also detracted from performance owing to individual stock selection which was partially offset by a favorable underweight allocation to the sector. The Fund's cash allocation, which averaged 8.1% during the reporting period, also detracted from relative performance given the solid market rally.

The Fund's major portfolio categories, as a percentage of Net Asset Value as at September 30, 2023, include approximately 94.0% in Canadian equity via its holdings in the Underlying Funds and ETFs, 7.0% in cash and cash equivalents and 1.0% in other net liabilities. During the reporting period, the Fund's allocation to Canadian equity remained fairly consistent.

The Fund had net subscriptions of approximately \$10 million for the current period, as compared to net subscriptions of approximately \$3 million in the prior period. The portfolio manager does not believe that subscription activity had a meaningful impact on the Fund's performance or the ability to implement its investment strategy.

Recent Developments

Global equities gained ground during the reporting period but faced significant uncertainty, fueled by sticky inflation and higher interest rates, China's faltering economic recovery and a short-lived banking crisis in March 2023. Companies with exposure to artificial intelligence and large language models led a significant market rally, though this was limited to a very narrow group of stocks for the first five calendar months of 2023. However, market breadth started to widen in the final four months of the reporting period as rising real interest rates negatively impacted longer duration equities, which included many technology-focused companies. Long duration equities (often growth-oriented companies) are expected to produce their highest cash flows in the future and thus more sensitive to interest rate changes. The U.S. Federal Reserve (the "Fed") hiked policy rates six times during the reporting period. However, the Fed paused its rate hiking cycle at its September 2023 meeting to assess the lagged effects of rate hikes on the economy as inflationary pressures modestly eased. Elsewhere, core inflation in Europe and the UK remained sticky through the reporting period. Furthermore, Russia backed out of the Black Sea grain trade agreement in July 2023, reviving concerns about global food inflation.

During the second calendar quarter of 2023, Canada's economy stalled, failing to build on the momentum from the previous quarter. The Bank of Canada ("BoC") paused its rate hiking cycle in February 2023 after inflation continued its steady decline until June 2023. However, after inflation

spiked in July 2023, the BoC hiked rates at its July meeting. Unemployment remained unchanged at 5.5% in August 2023 from the previous month, the highest since September 2022. Wage gains remained solid, supported by resilient job growth in the economy. However, the housing crisis due to significantly higher mortgage rates, and the delay of the multi-billion dollar clean technology tax credits added to investor concerns. Towards the end of the reporting period, merchandise trade rebounded as exports of gold to the U.S. and higher crude oil prices, exceeded imports, resulting in a positive trade balance in September 2023.

The S&P/TSX Index climbed 9.5% during the reporting period. Information Technology, Energy and Consumer Discretionary were the top three performing sectors in the index during the reporting period, while Utilities, Communication Services, and Real Estate were the bottom three sectors. Large capitalization stocks out-performed small capitalization stocks during the reporting period, while growth stocks out-performed value stocks.

The portfolio manager continues to believe Canadian equity markets remain well-positioned in the current volatile environment. As inflation remained elevated, the BoC hiked rates in July 2023 but refrained from hiking again at its September 2023 meeting. Even in the current inflationary environment, the portfolio manager believes the investment narrative should continue to improve and provide a better backdrop for equities.

The portfolio manager continues to focus on companies with low leverage and higher visibility. Growth companies present a good opportunity in the near future, and the portfolio manager will look to capitalize on investment opportunities when they arise. The portfolio manager believes this higher quality, diversified approach can help protect the Fund during periods of elevated uncertainty and volatility in global equity markets.

Related Party Transactions

AGFI is the manager ("Manager") and trustee of the Fund. Pursuant to the management agreement between the Fund and AGFI, AGFI is responsible for the day-to-day business of the Fund. AGFI also acts as the investment (portfolio) manager of the Fund, providing analysis and making decisions as to which Underlying Funds and ETFs the Fund invests in and the target weighting of the Fund's assets. Fees payable to AGFI for such services are payable directly by unitholders and are not expenses of the Fund.

AGFI pays for all of the operating expenses relating to the operation of the Fund, except for certain costs as disclosed in the current prospectus, in exchange for a fixed rate administration fee. The administration fee is calculated based on the Net Asset Value of the Fund at a fixed annual rate of 0.32%. Administration fees of approximately \$25,000 were incurred by the Fund during the period ended September 30, 2023.

AGFI is an indirect wholly-owned subsidiary of AGF Management Limited.

Explanatory Notes

- (1) a) This information is derived from the Fund's audited annual financial statements. Under International Financial Reporting Standards ("IFRS"), investments that are traded in an active market are generally valued at closing price, which is determined to be within the bid-ask spread and most representative of fair value. As a result, there is no difference between the net assets per unit presented in the financial statements ("Net Assets") and the net asset value per unit calculated for fund pricing purposes ("Net Asset Value").
 - b) The Fund commenced operations in July 2022, which represents the date upon which securities were first made available for purchase by investors.
- (2) Net Assets and distributions are based on the actual number of units outstanding at the relevant time. The increase/decrease from operations is based on the weighted average number of units outstanding over the financial period.
- (3) Distributions were paid in cash/reinvested in additional units of the Fund, or both. The characterization of the distributions is based on management's estimate of the actual income for the year.

- (4) This is not a reconciliation of the beginning and ending Net Assets per unit.
- (5) The management expense ratio ("MER") is calculated in accordance with National Instrument 81-106, based on all the expenses of the Fund (including Harmonized Sales Tax, Goods and Services Tax and interest, but excluding foreign withholding taxes, commissions and other portfolio transaction costs) and the Fund's proportionate share of the MER, if applicable, of the underlying funds and ETFs in which the Fund has invested, expressed as an annualized percentage of average daily Net Asset Value during the period.
- (6) AGFI waived certain fees or absorbed certain expenses otherwise payable by the Fund. The amount of expenses waived or absorbed is determined annually at the discretion of AGFI and AGFI can terminate the waiver or absorption at any time.
- (7) The trading expense ratio represents total commissions and other portfolio transaction costs, including the Fund's proportionate share of the commissions, if applicable, of the underlying funds and ETFs in which the Fund has invested, expressed as an annualized percentage of average daily Net Asset Value during the period.
- (8) The Fund's portfolio turnover rate ("PTR") indicates how actively the Fund's portfolio advisor manages its portfolio investments. A PTR of 100% is equivalent to the Fund buying and selling all of the securities in its portfolio once in the course of the year. The higher a fund's PTR in a year, the greater the trading costs payable by the fund in the year, and the greater the chance of an investor receiving taxable capital gains in the year. There is not necessarily a relationship between a high turnover rate and the performance of a fund.

PTR is calculated based on the lesser of the cumulative cost of purchases or cumulative proceeds of sales divided by the average market value of the portfolio, excluding short-term investments.

Management Fees

The Fund is managed by AGFI. AGFI is responsible for the day-to-day operations of the Fund, which include providing investment and management services as well as other administrative services required by the Fund. The management fees for such services are payable directly by the unitholders, not by the Fund.


Past Performance*
