# AGF Emerging Markets Balanced Fund

SEPTEMBER 30, 2016



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## Management Discussion of Fund Performance

This management discussion of fund performance represents the portfolio management team's view of the significant factors and developments affecting the fund's performance and outlook.

### Investment Objective and Strategies

Pursuant to the Declaration of Trust, the investment objective of AGF Emerging Markets Balanced Fund (the "Fund") is to provide above-average long-term total return by investing primarily in a mix of emerging market equity and fixed income (via mutual funds and/or underlying holdings), as well as cash and cash equivalents. AGF Investments Inc. ("AGFI"), as portfolio manager, allocates assets of the Fund among two or more underlying funds, which are managed by AGFI, and uses an asset allocation approach to adjust its holdings between equity and fixed income. The portfolio manager may also invest directly in securities using bottom-up stock selection within the equity component, favouring companies that are believed to be trading at a significant discount to their underlying cash earnings potential. A bottom-up investment approach focuses attention on a specific company rather than on the industry in which that company operates or on the economy as a whole. Within the equity component, the portfolio manager intends to invest primarily in issuers located in emerging markets, as defined by the Morgan Stanley Capital International Emerging Markets Index ("MSCI Emerging Markets Index"). The portfolio manager focuses on discovering those companies with strong franchise, positive earnings/earnings sustainability, above-average cash generation, and ability or prospective ability to pay dividends. Within the fixed income component, the portfolio manager employs a top-down investment approach based on currency, country and category allocation, and duration management. A top-down investment approach involves looking at the "big picture" in the economy and financial world and then breaking those components down into finer details. The portfolio manager takes a diversified approach by expanding beyond emerging market sovereign debt and investing in the entire emerging market fixed income opportunity set. In periods of unusual market conditions, a significant portion of the Fund's assets may be held in cash or fixed income securities.

### Risk

The risks of investing in the Fund remain as disclosed in the current prospectus. The principal risks associated with the Fund are changes in legislation risk, concentration risk, counterparty risk, credit risk, depository securities and receipts risk, derivative risk, emerging markets risk, equity risk, exchange traded fund ("ETF") general risks, ETF index risks, ETF industry sector risk, foreign currency risk, foreign market risk, gold and silver ETFs risk, interest rate risk, liquidity risk, repurchase agreement risk, reverse repurchase agreement risk, securities lending risk, small company risk, specialization risk, substantial securityholder

risk and underlying fund risk. The Fund is suitable for investors investing for the medium term, seeking a portfolio of emerging market equity and fixed income securities in a single fund and who have medium tolerance for risk.

### Results of Operations

For the year ended September 30, 2016, the Mutual Fund Units of the Fund returned 8.4% (net of expenses) while the MSCI Emerging Markets Index, the J.P. Morgan GBIEM Global Diversified Index and the Blended Benchmark returned 15.6%, 15.4% and 14.8%, respectively. The Blended Benchmark is composed of 50% MSCI Emerging Markets Index/20% J.P. Morgan GBIEM Global Diversified Index/17.5% J.P. Morgan CEMBI Broad Diversified Index/12.5% J.P. Morgan EMBI Global Index. The performance of the other series of the Fund is substantially similar to that of the Mutual Fund Units, save for differences in expense structure. Refer to "Past Performance" section for performance information of such series.

The Fund currently invests in Series S Units of AGF Emerging Markets Bond Fund and AGF Emerging Markets Fund (the "Underlying Funds"), managed by AGFI. The following represents the portfolio management team's view of the significant developments affecting the Underlying Funds' performance.

The Fund under-performed the MSCI Emerging Markets Index and the J.P. Morgan GBIEM Global Diversified Index due to the inclusion of external bonds and emerging market corporate bonds in the fixed income component of the Underlying Funds. These fixed income securities under-performed emerging market equities and emerging market local currency bonds as emerging market currencies mostly rallied during the period under review.

The Fund also under-performed the MSCI Emerging Markets Index and the Blended Benchmark due to country and sector allocation, though this was partially offset by security selection contributing positively. Relative country and sector allocation in the equity component of the Underlying Funds remained a residual of bottom-up stock selection. Active exposure to the health care and information technology sectors within the equity component of the Underlying Funds detracted from relative performance, while active exposure to the industrials and telecommunication services sectors contributed. From a country allocation perspective, active exposure to Mexico and Czech Republic detracted from relative performance, while active exposure to China, Hong Kong and Peru contributed.

Category allocation within the fixed income component of the Underlying Funds, relative to the Blended Benchmark, contributed to performance. Its overweight allocation to local currency bonds and external bonds contributed to returns as these two fixed income categories performed strongly during the period under review. In addition, the underweight allocation to the under-performing emerging market corporate bonds,

within the fixed income portion of the Underlying Funds, also contributed.

The Fund had net redemptions of approximately \$11 million for the current period, as compared to net redemptions of approximately \$12 million for the prior period. The portfolio manager does not believe that redemption activity had a meaningful impact on the Fund's performance or the ability to implement its investment strategy.

Total expenses before foreign withholding taxes, commissions and other portfolio transaction costs vary period over period mainly as a result of changes in average Net Asset Values (see Explanatory Note (1) a)) and investor activity, such as number of investor accounts and transactions. The decrease in management fees accounted for most of the decrease in expenses during the period as compared to the previous period due to a decrease in average Net Asset Values. On the contrary, the increase in custodian fees was due to the change in third party service provider during the current period. All other expenses remained fairly consistent throughout the periods.

#### Recent Developments

The portfolio manager is positive on emerging market equities over the next 12 to 18 months as return on equity in emerging markets is now trending upward for the first time since 2000. This has been driven by margin expansion as productivity growth is out-pacing real wage growth for the first time since 2010. Furthermore, the valuation of emerging market equities relative to developed market equities is at historical lows, which coupled with improving profitability bodes well for emerging market equities out-performance. The gap in gross domestic product growth between emerging market and developed market countries is also expected to widen in favor of emerging markets, and the portfolio manager expects this to in turn support relative earnings momentum. It is also worth noting that while a number of emerging market countries have cut rates over the past calendar year, the portfolio manager believes there is significant scope for central banks to cut rates further, particularly as inflation levels decline, which would be conducive to further growth.

The portfolio manager of the Underlying Funds currently favors countries that are implementing structural reforms as these countries are expected to benefit from higher potential growth rates that in turn drive longer term out-performance. India, Mexico, and more recently Indonesia are examples of countries that have proposed and implemented a number of reforms, which will benefit their economies and financial markets over the long-term. There is also potential for reforms in Brazil, after the current crisis, and in Thailand, after the elections in 2017, to bolster performance.

Some of the risks the portfolio manager continues to watch include a significant weakening in emerging market currencies, particularly in the face of persistent U.S. dollar strength. The portfolio manager of the Underlying Funds maintains an underweight to neutral position to countries with a current account deficit, such as South Africa and Turkey, as these tend to be most vulnerable to a strong U.S. dollar. That said, concerns over slowing growth in developed markets may result in lower long-term interest rates and a delay in tightening by the U.S. Federal Reserve, providing a floor to emerging market currencies. The portfolio manager also continues to monitor the property market in China, where

prices have risen significantly, as well as the risk of a significant devaluation of the Chinese Yuan. The portfolio manager's central case scenario is that steps taken by Chinese authorities to contain the property market, including placing restrictions on secondary mortgages in Tier 1 cities where affordability is most challenged, will serve to put a lid on the property market. Also, as the Chinese Yuan has already softened over the past calendar year and China's export market share position remains strong, the portfolio manager does not expect Chinese authorities to significantly devalue the Chinese Yuan. This view is predicated on China maintaining control of its capital account outflows.

For the fixed income component of the Underlying Funds, the portfolio manager expects bond yields to gradually move higher in the near term, supported by more favourable growth and inflation prospects as the economy continues to recover from weak growth earlier in calendar year 2016. However, the portfolio manager anticipates yields to remain in a low range as the global economy continues to experience anemic growth and central bank accommodation remains supportive.

For the equity component of the Underlying Funds, the portfolio manager believes that to capture attractive opportunities and to help mitigate the potential risks when investing in emerging markets, active management remains key to adding value. The portfolio manager uses a long-term, bottom-up investment approach and, as a result, has positioned the equity portfolio of the Underlying Funds to benefit from exposure to the long-term secular trend of emerging market domestic demand from both consumers and enterprises. By diversifying the Underlying Funds' equity holdings in light of expected volatility ahead, the portfolio manager continues to look for companies that can deliver positive economic value added.

#### Related Party Transactions

AGFI is the manager ("Manager") and trustee of the Fund. Pursuant to the management agreement between the Fund and AGFI, AGFI is responsible for the day-to-day business of the Fund. As indicated above, AGFI also acts as the investment (portfolio) manager, managing the investment portfolio of the Fund. Under the management agreement, the Fund (except for Series O, Series Q and Series W Units, if applicable) pays management fees, calculated based on the Net Asset Value of the respective series of the Fund. Management fees of approximately \$862,000 were incurred by the Fund during the period ended September 30, 2016.

Effective February 15, 2016, AGF CustomerFirst Inc. ("AGFC"), a wholly owned subsidiary of AGF Management Limited, provides transfer agency services to the Fund pursuant to a services agreement with AGFI. Unitholder servicing and administrative fees of approximately \$45,000 incurred by the Fund were paid to AGFC for the period from February 15, 2016 to September 30, 2016.

## Explanatory Notes

(1) a) This information is derived from the Fund's audited annual financial statements. Prior to October 1, 2014, the net assets per unit presented in the financial statements ("Net Assets") was calculated using different valuation techniques for certain investments as required under Canadian GAAP. This had no impact on the Net Assets per unit since the series net asset value per unit calculated for fund pricing purposes ("Net Asset Value") of the Underlying Funds held was the most readily and regularly available price as no bid prices were available. This remains unchanged with the adoption of IFRS effective October 1, 2014.

For the purpose of comparability with the period ended September 30, 2016, total Net Asset Value and number of units outstanding presented for the period ended September 30, 2015 may have been adjusted to include certain transactions, if applicable. These adjustments have no effect on the Net Asset Value per unit.

b) The following series of the Fund commenced operations on the following dates, which represents the date upon which securities of a series were first made available for purchase by investors.

(2) Net Assets and distributions are based on the actual number of units outstanding at the relevant time. The increase/decrease from operations is based on the weighted average number of units outstanding over the financial period.

(3) Distributions were paid in cash/reinvested in additional units of the Fund, or both. The characterization of the distributions is based on management's estimate of the actual income for the year.

(4) This is not a reconciliation of the beginning and ending Net Assets per unit.

(5) The management expense ratio ("MER") of a particular series is calculated in accordance with National Instrument 81-106, based on all the expenses of the Fund (including Harmonized Sales Tax, Goods and Services Tax and interest, but excluding foreign withholding taxes, commissions and other portfolio transaction costs) allocated to that series, expressed as an annualized percentage of average daily Net Asset Value of that series during the period.

As a result of the Fund's investment in the Underlying Funds, the MER is calculated based on the expenses of the Fund allocated to that series, including expenses indirectly incurred by the Fund attributable to its investment in the Underlying Funds, divided by the average daily Net Asset Value of the series of the Fund during the period.

The Fund does not pay duplicate management and advisory fees, as applicable, on the portion of the assets that it invests in the Underlying Funds. Accordingly, AGFI will waive the management and advisory fees payable or paid by the Underlying Funds in order to avoid such duplication.

(6) AGFI waived certain fees or absorbed certain expenses otherwise payable by the Fund. The amount of expenses waived or absorbed is determined annually on a series by series basis at the discretion of AGFI and AGFI can terminate the waiver or absorption at any time.

(7) The trading expense ratio ("TER") represents total commissions and other portfolio transaction costs expressed as an annualized percentage of average daily Net Asset Value during the period.

As a result of the Fund's investment in the Underlying Funds, the TER is calculated based on commissions and other portfolio transaction costs of the Fund, including such costs that are indirectly incurred by the Fund attributable to its investment in each of the Underlying Funds, divided by the average daily Net Asset Value of the Fund during the period.

(8) The Fund's portfolio turnover rate ("PTR") indicates how actively the Fund's portfolio advisor manages its portfolio investments. A PTR of 100% is equivalent to the Fund buying and selling all of the securities in its portfolio once in the course of the year. The higher a fund's PTR in a year, the greater the trading costs payable by the fund in the year, and the greater the chance of an investor receiving taxable capital gains in the year. There is not necessarily a relationship between a high turnover rate and the performance of a fund.

PTR is calculated based on the lesser of the cumulative cost of purchases or cumulative proceeds of sales divided by the average market value of the portfolio, excluding short-term investments.

## Management Fees

The Fund is managed by AGFI. As a result of providing investment and management services, AGFI receives a monthly management fee, based on the Net Asset Value of the respective series, calculated daily and payable monthly. Management fees in respect of Series O, Series Q and Series W Units, if applicable, are arranged directly between the Manager and investors and are not expenses of the Fund. AGFI uses these management fees to pay for sales and trailing commissions to registered dealers on the distribution of the Fund's units, investment advice, as well as for general administrative expenses such as overhead, salaries, rent, legal and accounting fees relating to AGFI's role as manager.

It is AGFI's policy to report rates of return for series in existence greater than one year. The performance start date for each series represents the date of the first purchase of such series, excluding seed money.



## Year-By-Year Returns



The MSCI Emerging Markets Index is a free float-adjusted market capitalization index that is designed to measure the equity market performance of emerging markets.

The J.P. Morgan GBIEM Global Diversified Index comprises government bonds with maturities greater than one year from countries that have been ranked by the World Bank as Lower/Upper/Middle income for two to five consecutive years. This index was created to capture a diverse set of countries that most investors can access and replicate through bonds or derivatives.

The J.P. Morgan CEMBI Broad Diversified Index comprises bonds with one to five years to maturity from companies that are headquartered in emerging markets countries whose assets are 100% located in or secured by assets located in emerging markets countries. The index uses only a certain portion of the current face amount of the outstanding instruments from countries with larger debt stocks.

The J.P. Morgan EMBI Global Index is a traditional, market capitalization-weighted index which includes both fixed and floating rate instruments, including callable or puttable instruments, as well as capitalizing/amortizing bonds or loans denominated in U.S. dollars. It comprises bonds from countries that have been included in the World Bank Low/Middle income statistics for two consecutive years. Only those bonds issued by sovereign and quasi-sovereign entities are eligible for index inclusion.
