AGF Fixed Income Plus Fund

MARCH 31, 2017



Management Discussion of Fund Performance

This management discussion of fund performance represents the portfolio management team's view of the significant factors and developments affecting the fund's performance and outlook.

Results of Operations

For the six months ended March 31, 2017, the Mutual Fund Units of AGF Fixed Income Plus Fund (the "Fund") returned -1.9% (net of expenses) while the FTSE TMX Canada Universe Bond Index ("FTSE TMX Universe Bond Index") returned -2.2%. The performance of the other series of the Fund is substantially similar to that of the Mutual Fund Units, save for differences in expense structure. Refer to "Past Performance" section for performance information of such series.

The Fund out-performed the FTSE TMX Universe Bond Index due to its overweight allocation to investment grade corporate bonds, underweight allocation to government bonds and out-of-benchmark exposure to high yield bonds and convertible securities. The Fund's lower duration relative to the benchmark contributed, though higher exposure to long-term Government of Canada bonds detracted as yields rose during the reporting period. The Fund's modest exposure to the U.S. dollar contributed positively as a result of its appreciation relative to the Canadian dollar during the reporting period. The Fund's modest exposure to emerging markets debt detracted as a result of security selection effects. The Fund's exposure to investment grade corporate bonds and government bonds (excluding provincial bonds) averaged approximately 37.0% and 26.0% over the reporting period, respectively.

The Fund entered into foreign exchange forward contracts during the period under review. As of March 31, 2017, the Fund was long Canadian dollar and short U.S. dollar in order to hedge its currency exposure.

Certain series of the Fund, as applicable, make quarterly distributions at a rate determined by AGF Investments Inc. ("AGFI") from time to time. If the aggregate amount of the quarterly distributions made to a series in a year exceeds the portion of the net income and net realized capital gains allocated to such series, the excess will constitute a return of capital. The portfolio manager does not believe that the distributions made by the Fund had a meaningful impact on the Fund's ability to implement its investment strategy or to fulfill its investment objectives.

The Fund had net subscriptions of approximately \$1 million for the current period, as compared to net subscriptions of approximately \$494 million in the prior period. Rebalancing by an institutional program resulted in net redemptions of approximately \$28 million in the Fund. The portfolio manager does not believe that subscription/redemption activity had a meaningful impact on the Fund's performance or the ability to implement its investment strategy.

Total expenses before foreign withholding taxes, commissions and other portfolio transaction costs vary period over period mainly as a result of changes in average Net Asset Values (see Explanatory Note (1) a)) and investor activity, such as number of investor accounts and transactions. Expenses have increased as compared to the previous period due mainly to an increase in average Net Asset Values and investor activity. In particular, custodian fees increased due to an increase in market value of investment portfolio. The increase in audit and registration fees and decrease in annual and interim reports and interest expense were due to variances between the accrued amounts versus the actual expenses incurred in the previous period. All other expenses remained fairly consistent throughout the periods.

Recent Developments

Economic data released during the reporting period showed that U.S. gross domestic product ("GDP") growth was higher than expected at 3.5% in the third calendar quarter of 2016, though slowed to 1.9% in the last calendar quarter of 2016. U.S. consumer prices recorded their largest gain in nearly four years with a consumer price index ("CPI") reading of 2.5% year over year in January 2017 and then 2.7% in February 2017. Core CPI (excluding volatile items such as food and energy) came in at 2.3% year over year in January 2017 and 2.2% in February 2017. Canadian economic data also improved during the reporting period, with GDP growth rising at a faster-than-expected pace of 2.6% in the final calendar quarter of 2016, supported by record automobile sales. The beginning of the year saw further strength, as Canadian retail sales rebounded 2.2% in January 2017, the largest gain in almost seven years, led again by purchases of automobiles. Stronger-than-expected wholesale trade and manufacturing figures were also reported in January 2017.

In Canada, economic growth continues to rebound from the sluggishness of 2015 and early 2016 as energy prices recover and household consumption remains robust. In addition, should U.S. growth strengthen, exports in Canada could benefit. However, record level of Canadian household debt, coupled with the implementation of several housing policy measures may pose challenges to consumer spending. The U.S. Federal Reserve is likely to raise federal funds rate further in the coming months, albeit at a gradual pace. European Central Bank is expected to announce a reduction in or cessation of asset purchases later this year. Bank of Canada's interest rate policy is expected to remain on hold in the near term as exports remain subdued and inflation and unemployment trends remain stable.

The major political risks that commenced in 2016 have been well telegraphed and may not have as great a capacity to surprise in 2017. Nonetheless, markets were negatively impacted by the Trump administration's failed health care bill and focus will now be on the current administration's ability to pass through pro-growth policies, such as tax reforms. Two major global political events to watch in 2017 are elections in France in April and Germany in September.

As a result of rising bond yields during the final calendar quarter of 2016, government bonds in the short end of the curve (up to 5 years in maturity) out-performed the mid- and long-term portions of the curve over the reporting period. Investment grade corporate bonds out-performed government bonds, which succumbed to steeper losses amid higher rates and meagre coupon income to protect against rising rates. High yield bonds performed strongly relative to most other fixed income categories due to tightening spreads and higher coupon income, while convertible securities out-performed alongside higher equity valuations.

In the near term, the portfolio manager expects the bond yields to likely remain range-bound, should economic data remain healthy and geopolitical risks remain stable. However, yields are likely to move higher if global growth and inflation prospects become more favourable later this year. Though, in portfolio manager's view, rates are unlikely to move substantially higher as significantly higher rates would likely start compressing economic activity.

The portfolio manager's outlook is currently mildly positive as economic growth momentum continues, partially offset by the somewhat elevated valuations of riskier asset classes. Consequently, the portfolio manager prefers investment grade corporate bonds over government bonds, which may struggle if yields increase. The portfolio manager remains neutral on high yield bonds; while defaults should not be significant in the absence of a recession, corporate fundamentals have started to improve and valuations are closer to high end of their historical range. The portfolio manager believes that equities, and hence convertible bonds, should benefit from monetary and fiscal stimulus this year as economic activity improves.

Related Party Transactions

AGFI is the manager ("Manager") and trustee of the Fund. Pursuant to the management agreement between the Fund and the AGFI, AGFI is responsible for the day-to-day business of the Fund. AGFI also acts as the investment (portfolio) manager, managing the investment portfolio of the Fund. Under the management agreement, the Fund (except for Series O, Series Q and Series W Units, if applicable) pays management fees calculated based on the Net Asset Value of the respective series of the Fund. Management fees of approximately \$7,643,000 were incurred by the Fund during the six month period ended March 31, 2017.

AGF CustomerFirst Inc. ("AGFC") provides transfer agency services to the Fund pursuant to a services agreement with AGFI. Unitholder servicing and administrative fees of approximately \$766,000 were incurred by the Fund during the six month period ended March 31, 2017.

AGFI and AGFC are indirect wholly-owned subsidiaries of AGF Management Limited.

Explanatory Notes

(1) a) This information is derived from the Fund's audited annual financial statements and unaudited interim financial statements. Prior to October 1, 2014, the net assets per unit presented in the financial statements ("Net Assets") differed from the net asset value per unit calculated for fund pricing purposes ("Net Asset Value"), due to differences in valuation techniques of certain investments as required under Canadian GAAP. The adoption of IFRS, effective October 1, 2014, has generally eliminated the difference between Net Assets per unit and Net Asset Value per unit.

Total Net Asset Value and number of units outstanding presented as at September 30, 2015 may have been adjusted to include certain transactions, if applicable, for the purpose of comparability with subsequent reporting periods. These adjustments have no effect on the Net Asset Value per unit.

b) The following series of the Fund commenced operations on the following dates, which represents the date upon which securities of a series were first made available for purchase by investors.

d) In May 2012, the Fund recommenced the offering of Series S Units that are available to institutional investors. Series S Units previously commenced offering in August 2011 and were closed due to full redemption by unitholders in August 2011. The financial data of the Series S Units includes the results of operations from date of recommencement.

(2) Net Assets and distributions are based on the actual number of units outstanding at the relevant time. The increase/decrease from operations is based on the weighted average number of units outstanding over the financial period.

(3) Distributions were paid in cash/reinvested in additional units of the Fund, or both. The computation of the distributions per unit does not take into account the management fee distributions (see note 5 below). The characterization of the distributions is based on management's estimate of the actual income for the year.

(4) This is not a reconciliation of the beginning and ending Net Assets per unit.

(5) The management expense ratio ("MER") of a particular series is calculated in accordance with National Instrument 81-106, based on all the expenses of the Fund (including Harmonized Sales Tax, Goods and Services Tax and interest, but excluding foreign withholding taxes, commissions and other portfolio transaction costs) and the Fund's proportionate share of the MER, if applicable, of the underlying funds and exchange traded funds ("ETFs") in which the Fund has invested, allocated to that series, expressed as an annualized percentage of average daily Net Asset Value of that series during the period.

AGFI may reduce the effective management fee payable by some unitholders by reducing the management fee it charges to the Fund and directing the Fund to make management fee distributions to these unitholders in amounts equal to the amounts of the management fee reduction. The MER does not take into account the reduction in management fees due to management fee distributions to unitholders.

- (6) AGFI waived certain fees or absorbed certain expenses otherwise payable by the Fund. The amount of expenses waived or absorbed is determined annually on a series by series basis at the discretion of AGFI and AGFI can terminate the waiver or absorption at any time.
- (7) The trading expense ratio represents total commissions and other portfolio transaction costs, including the Fund's proportionate share of the commissions, if applicable, of the underlying funds and ETFs in which the Fund has invested, expressed as an annualized percentage of average daily Net Asset Value during the period.
- (8) The Fund's portfolio turnover rate ("PTR") indicates how actively the Fund's portfolio advisor manages its portfolio investments. A PTR of 100% is equivalent to the Fund buying and selling all of the securities in its portfolio once in the course of the year. The higher a fund's PTR in a year, the greater the trading costs payable by the fund in the year, and the greater the chance of an investor receiving taxable capital gains in the year. There is not necessarily a relationship between a high turnover rate and the performance of a fund.

PTR is calculated based on the lesser of the cumulative cost of purchases or cumulative proceeds of sales divided by the average market value of the portfolio, excluding short-term investments.

Management Fees

The Fund is managed by AGFI. As a result of providing investment and management services, AGFI receives a monthly management fee, based on the Net Asset Value of the respective series, calculated daily and payable monthly. Management fees in respect of Series O, Series Q and Series W Units, if applicable, are arranged directly between the Manager and investors and are not expenses of the Fund. AGFI uses these management fees to pay for sales and trailing commissions to registered dealers on the distribution of the Fund's units, investment advice, as well as for general administrative expenses such as overhead, salaries, rent, legal and accounting fees relating to AGFI's role as manager.

Generally, for fund mergers, the continuing fund is considered a new fund for the purpose of calculating rates of return and therefore, the rates of return have not been provided for the period of the merger and previous periods. However, the mergers of AGF Canadian Bond Fund and AGF Inflation Plus Bond Fund with the Fund (see Explanatory Note (1) c)) did not constitute material changes to the Fund and accordingly did not impact the ability of the Fund to maintain its historical performance.

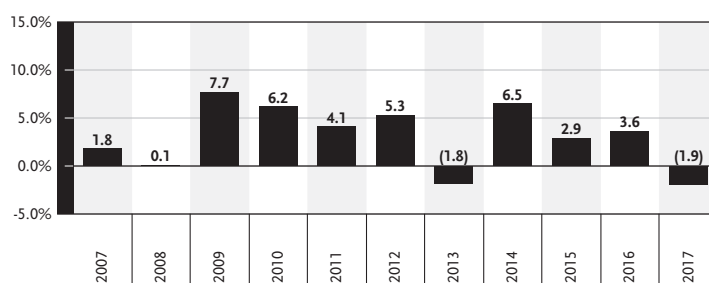

Year-By-Year Returns

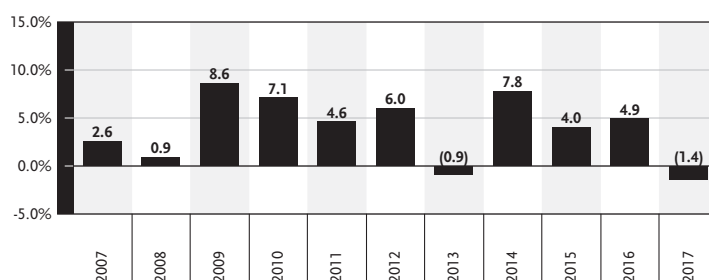

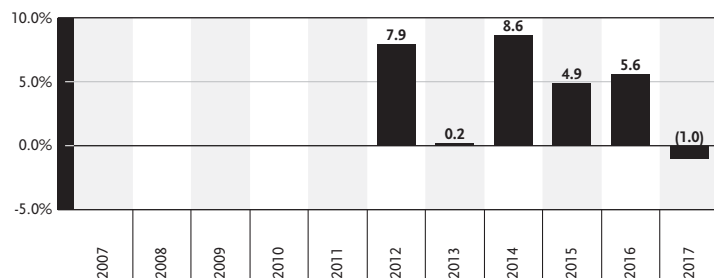
Mutual Fund Units



Series F Units

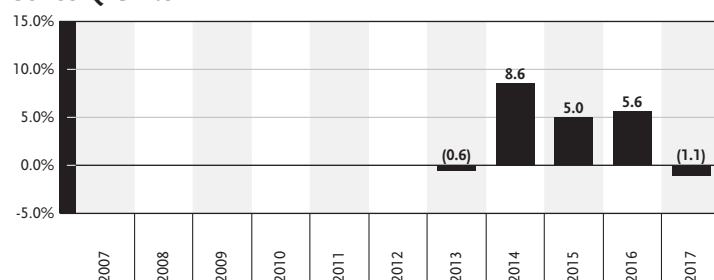


Series O Units



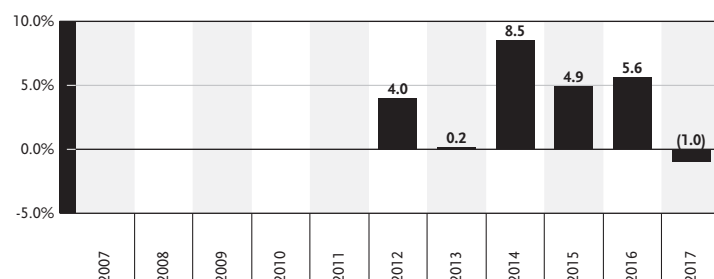

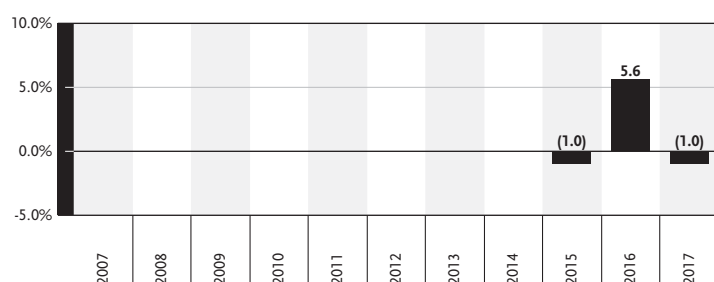
