Management Discussion of Fund Performance

This management discussion of fund performance represents the portfolio management team's view of the significant factors and developments affecting the fund's performance and outlook.

Results of Operations

AGF High Interest Savings Account Fund (the "Fund") commenced operations in July 2022.

As of March 31, 2023, the Fund invested substantially all of its assets in units of High Interest Savings Account Fund (the "Underlying Fund"), which is a fund managed by a third party.

Recent Developments

Bond markets remained volatile over the reporting period, driven by variable economic data, the banking system turmoil that arose in March 2023, central bank policies and the markets' reaction to them. Inflation levels broadly moderated but remained elevated versus target levels, and resilient economic activity also supported further central bank rate hikes, albeit at a more moderate pace. In recognition of the decelerating pace of inflation and growth, as well as the fact that monetary policy acts with a long and variable lag, the Bank of Canada elected to pause its rate hike campaign after raising rates in October 2022, December 2022 and January 2023. The monetary tightening cycle by the U.S. Federal Reserve and the European Central Bank continued through the period, albeit at a slower pace, in an effort to balance growth with persistent inflation.

During the last calendar quarter of 2022, Canada's economic growth stalled for the first time since the second calendar quarter of 2021, surprising many market participants. It was also a significant slowdown from the 2.3% annualized pace of growth seen in the third calendar quarter. This slowdown was mainly attributable to declines in business and housing investments. Inflation began easing off through the reporting period, as it fell to 5.9% in January 2023, the lowest since February 2022. Unemployment remained steady at 5.0% since 2023 began, with significant growth in private sector employment in February. The banking crisis in the U.S. has had a minimal impact on Canadian banks as they are in a much healthier position than their American counterparts.

The global economic outlook remains somewhat resilient despite the significant amount of tightening that has occurred so far. Inflation has remained sticky and although it may continue to decelerate in the coming months, central banks remain vigilant about the risk of a resurgence later in 2023. In addition, policymakers project that inflation will remain above target for the next few years. As a result, the bar remains guite high for central banks to cut interest rates

in 2023 unless the growth profile deteriorates significantly. Many developed market yield curves have been substantially inverted for some time, another leading indicator of slowing economic growth. Owing to the lagged effect of rate hikes, the Canadian economy could face a recession sometime in the second half of 2023 but the effects should be soft, given the absence of structural imbalances in the economy.

Related Party Transactions

AGF Investments Inc. ("AGFI") is the manager ("Manager") and trustee of the Fund. Pursuant to the management agreement between the Fund and AGFI, AGFI is responsible for the day-to-day business of the Fund. AGFI also acts as the investment (portfolio) manager of the Fund, managing the investment portfolio of the Fund. Fees payable to AGFI for such services are payable directly by unitholders and are not expenses of the Fund.

AGFI pays for all of the operating expenses relating to the operation of the Fund, except for certain costs as disclosed in the current prospectus, in exchange for a fixed rate administration fee. The administration fee is calculated based on the Net Asset Value of the Fund at a fixed annual rate of 0.32%. Administration fees of approximately \$61,000 were incurred by the Fund during the six months ended March 31, 2023.

AGFI is an indirect wholly-owned subsidiary of AGF Management Limited.

Explanatory Notes

- (1) a) This information is derived from the Fund's audited annual financial statements and unaudited interim financial statements. Under International Financial Reporting Standards ("IFRS"), investments that are traded in an active market are generally valued at closing price, which is determined to be within the bidask spread and most representative of fair value. As a result, there is no difference between the net assets per unit presented in the financial statements ("Net Assets") and the net asset value per unit calculated for fund pricing purposes ("Net Asset Value").
 - b) The Fund commenced operations in July 2022, which represents the date upon which securities were first made available for purchase by investors.
- (2) Net Assets and distributions are based on the actual number of units outstanding at the relevant time. The increase/decrease from operations is based on the weighted average number of units outstanding over the financial period.
- (3) Distributions were paid in cash/reinvested in additional units of the Fund, or both. The characterization of the distributions is based on management's estimate of the actual income for the year.
- (4) This is not a reconciliation of the beginning and ending Net Assets per unit.

- (5) The management expense ratio ("MER") is calculated in accordance with National Instrument 81-106, based on all the expenses of the Fund (including Harmonized Sales Tax, Goods and Services Tax and interest, but excluding foreign withholding taxes, commissions and other portfolio transaction costs) and the Fund's proportionate share of the MER, if applicable, of the underlying funds and exchange traded funds ("ETFs") in which the Fund has invested, expressed as an annualized percentage of average daily Net Asset Value during the period.
- (6) The trading expense ratio represents total commissions and other portfolio transaction costs, including the Fund's proportionate share of the commissions, if applicable, of the underlying funds and ETFs in which the Fund has invested, expressed as an annualized percentage of average daily Net Asset Value during the period.
- (7) The Fund's portfolio turnover rate ("PTR") indicates how actively the Fund's portfolio advisor manages its portfolio investments. A PTR of 100% is equivalent to the Fund buying and selling all of the securities in its portfolio once in the course of the year. The higher a fund's PTR in a year, the greater the trading costs payable by the fund in the year, and the greater the chance of an investor receiving taxable capital gains in the year. There is not necessarily a relationship between a high turnover rate and the performance of a fund.

PTR is calculated based on the lesser of the cumulative cost of purchases or cumulative proceeds of sales divided by the average market value of the portfolio, excluding short-term investments.

Management Fees

The Fund is managed by AGFI. AGFI is responsible for the day-to-day operations of the Fund, which include providing investment and management services as well as other administrative services required by the Fund. The management fees for such services are payable directly by the unitholders, not by the Fund.

AGFI bears all operating expenses relating to the operation of the Fund, except for certain costs as disclosed in the Fund's prospectus. In exchange, AGFI receives an administration fee at the annual rate of 0.32%, which is subject to applicable taxes, based on the Net Asset Value of the Fund, calculated daily and payable monthly.

Past Performance

It is AGFI's policy to report rates of return for a fund in existence greater than one year. The Fund commenced operations in July 2022.
