Management Discussion of Fund Performance

This management discussion of fund performance represents the portfolio management team's view of the significant factors and developments affecting the fund's performance and outlook.

Results of Operations

For the six months ended March 31, 2024, Series P Units of AGF High Interest Savings Account Fund (the "Fund") returned 2.4% (net of expenses) while the Bloomberg Canada 1-3 Month T-Bill Index returned 2.5%. The performance of the other series of the Fund is substantially similar to that of Series P Units, save for differences in expense structure. Refer to "Past Performance" section for performance information of such series.

As of March 31, 2024, the Fund invested substantially all of its assets in units of High Interest Savings Account Fund (the "Underlying Fund"), which is a fund managed by a third party.

On an expense-adjusted basis, the Fund out-performed the Bloomberg Canada 1-3 Month T-Bill Index. The Underlying Fund invested solely in bank deposits with Schedule 1 Canadian banks, which typically yield higher than 1-3 month treasury bills.

During the reporting period, high interest savings account funds became an increasingly attractive option for Canadian investors, as the Bank of Canada's ("BoC") higher interest rates have increased the amount of interest that can be earned from holding these highly liquid assets with short duration. Duration is a measure of the sensitivity of the portfolio to changes in interest rates.

The Fund had net subscriptions of approximately \$68 million for the current period, as compared to net subscriptions of approximately \$50 million in the prior period. The portfolio manager does not believe that subscription activity had a meaningful impact on the Fund's performance or the ability to implement its investment strategy.

Recent Developments

During the final calendar quarter of 2023, Canada's economy recovered from the contraction experienced in the previous quarter and recorded an expansion of 0.2%. The BoC kept interest rates unchanged at 5.0% for the fifth consecutive meeting in March 2024. The central bank is still concerned about annual inflation, even though it had fallen to 2.8% in February 2024, the lowest reading since June 2023. During its most recent meeting, the central bank's officials reiterated that the bank could not rule out the need to raise rates should inflation unexpectedly rise, though it was not the base case. The unemployment rate rose significantly to 6.1% over the reporting period, which was further proof of the lagged effects of elevated interest rates.

The Canadian economy's lack of substantial growth for much of 2023, and recent progress made on inflation, could place the BoC in a more favorable position to gradually lower policy rates in 2024. Furthermore, many higher cost mortgage renewals will become due in the coming year, straining an already burdened consumer. The Canadian yield curve remains inverted, however, offering a weaker risk-return profile for adding duration versus other developed nations with expectations of rate cuts later in the year. Volatility may persist due to fluctuations in the growth-versus-inflation narrative, as it will likely be driven by energy and commodity prices in the months ahead.

Related Party Transactions

AGF Investments Inc. ("AGFI") is the manager ("Manager") and trustee of the Fund. Pursuant to the management agreement between the Fund and AGFI, AGFI is responsible for the day-to-day business of the Fund. AGFI also acts as the investment (portfolio) manager of the Fund, managing the investment portfolio of the Fund. Fees payable to AGFI for such services are payable directly by unitholders and are not expenses of the Fund.

AGFI pays for all of the operating expenses relating to the operation of the Fund, except for certain costs as disclosed in the current prospectus, in exchange for a fixed rate administration fee payable by Series P Units. The administration fee is calculated based on the Net Asset Value of Series P Units of the Fund at a fixed annual rate of 0.32%. Administration fees of approximately \$242,000 were incurred by the Fund during the six months ended March 31, 2024.

AGFI is an indirect wholly-owned subsidiary of AGF Management Limited.

Explanatory Notes

- (1) a) This information is derived from the Fund's audited annual financial statements and unaudited interim financial statements. Under International Financial Reporting Standards ("IFRS"), investments that are traded in an active market are generally valued at closing price, which is determined to be within the bidask spread and most representative of fair value. As a result, there is no difference between the net assets per unit presented in the financial statements ("Net Assets") and the net asset value per unit calculated for fund pricing purposes ("Net Asset Value").
 - b) The following series of the Fund commenced operations on the following dates, which represents the date upon which securities of a series were first made available for purchase by investors.

- (2) Net Assets and distributions are based on the actual number of units outstanding at the relevant time. The increase/decrease from operations is based on the weighted average number of units outstanding over the financial period.
- (3) Distributions were paid in cash/reinvested in additional units of the Fund, or both. The characterization of the distributions is based on management's estimate of the actual income for the year.
- (4) This is not a reconciliation of the beginning and ending Net Assets per unit.
- (5) The management expense ratio ("MER") of a particular series is calculated in accordance with National Instrument 81-106, based on all the expenses of the Fund (including Harmonized Sales Tax, Goods and Services Tax and interest, but excluding foreign withholding taxes, commissions and other portfolio transaction costs) and the Fund's proportionate share of the MER, if applicable, of the underlying funds and exchange traded funds ("ETFs") in which the Fund has invested, allocated to that series, expressed as an annualized percentage of average daily Net Asset Value of that series during the period. For new series launched during the period, the MER is annualized from the date of the first external purchase.
- (6) AGFI waived certain fees or absorbed certain expenses otherwise payable by the Fund. The amount of expenses waived or absorbed is determined annually on a series by series basis at the discretion of AGFI and AGFI can terminate the waiver or absorption at any time.
- (7) The trading expense ratio represents total commissions and other portfolio transaction costs, including the Fund's proportionate share of the commissions, if applicable, of the underlying funds and ETFs in which the Fund has invested, expressed as an annualized percentage of average daily Net Asset Value during the period.

(8) The Fund's portfolio turnover rate ("PTR") indicates how actively the Fund's portfolio advisor manages its portfolio investments. A PTR of 100% is equivalent to the Fund buying and selling all of the securities in its portfolio once in the course of the year. The higher a fund's PTR in a year, the greater the trading costs payable by the fund in the year, and the greater the chance of an investor receiving taxable capital gains in the year. There is not necessarily a relationship between a high turnover rate and the performance of a fund.

PTR is calculated based on the lesser of the cumulative cost of purchases or cumulative proceeds of sales divided by the average market value of the portfolio, excluding shortterm investments.

Management Fees

The Fund is managed by AGFI. AGFI is responsible for the day-to-day operations of the Fund, which include providing investment and management services as well as other administrative services required by the Fund. The management fees for such services are payable directly by the unitholders, not by the Fund.

Past Performance*

The performance information shown assumes that all distributions made by the Fund in the periods shown were reinvested in additional securities of the Fund. Note that the performance information does not take into account sales, redemption, distribution or other optional charges that would have reduced returns or performance. How the Fund has performed in the past does not necessarily indicate how it will perform in the future.

It is AGFI's policy to report rates of return for series in existence greater than one year. The performance start date for each series represents the external launch date of the series. Series O Units commenced operations in July 2023.


All rates of return are calculated based on the Net Asset Value.
